Wolds Ward Laceby Update July 2023

Crime

There have been thirty four reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for June. Of these, the following have occurred in Laceby village.

There were six crimes recorded involving the male with mental health issues as mentioned last month. There is ongoing work in relation to this male across partner agencies.

Other crimes include:

One assault.

One report of sending malicious communications.

Two reports of harassment.

One minor public order offence.

There were nine reports of ASB within Laceby village:

Youths causing issues St Francis Grove x2. Illegal riding of motorbikes in the village x4. Neighbour disputes x3
