Wolds Ward Laceby Update August 2023

Crime

There have been thirty four reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for July. Of these, the following have occurred in Laceby village.

During the early hours of 22nd July, a vehicle parked on Grimsby Road, Laceby had a nearside window smashed. As the offender reached in, the alarm sounded causing the offender to flee.

A bay windowpane at a property on St Francis Grove was smashed after stones were thrown at then window.

Other crimes include:

Five assault.

One report of sending malicious communications.

Three reports of harassment.

Three minor public order offences.

There were three reports of ASB within Laceby village:

Illegal riding of motorbikes in the village x2.

Youths causing issues St Francis Grove.
