Wolds Ward Laceby Update September 2022

Crime

There were forty-two reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for August. Of these, the following have occurred in Laceby village.

Overnight 5th & 6th August fishing equipment was stolen from a shed in a garden on Church Lane.

During the early hours of 6th August, entry was gained into a home on Lauridson Close. Property was stolen. The intruder left when the occupant awoke and saw the intruder in the home.

Overnight 24th & 25th August, the same property was targeted. Access was gained to the rear garden, but damage was caused to the door handle and lock in an effort to break in. No entry was gained.

About 10.45pm on 25th August an attempt was made to steal a car parked outside its address on Keith Crescent. Entry was made, and the ignition was attacked. The would be thieves were disturbed by the car owner, and both made off from the scene on a moped.

Other crime include:

Three assaults.

Three offences of sending malicious communications.

One report of harassment.

There was one report of ASB. Occupants of two cars regularly causing issues in Laceby urinating in the street and believed to be smoking cannabis.
